Improvements in Education



Background:

We know that delivery of education is difficult in crowded Emergency Departments. Strategies need to be more innovative in order to work in the current climate.

Aims:

Education Fellows to improve educational opportunities within the Emergency Department and enhance accessibility of Workplace-based Assessments (WPBAs).

#EM3 is a multimedia FOAMed resource. Our developments this year include:

Monthly themes to provide structured content, including infographics and blogs.

Educational videos for practical procedures have been developed and disseminated to support hands-on teaching.

Online booking for shop floor teaching, CBD clinics and simulation has been introduced to improve trainee autonomy, reduce administration and provide up to date availability (bookable ESLE slots will be available soon).



In Situ Simulation:

In situ simulation has evolved from ad hoc learning, to a protected pre-bookable session.

These MDT simulations are run during clinical shifts to promote non-technical skills and to complete WPBAs. For more advanced HST simulations, Education Fellows are joined by a consultant.



Shop floor teaching:

Consultants supernumerary to the clinical numbers provide 1:1 shop floor teaching.

Each Education Fellow now provides an additional session per week.

The benefits include a regular educational presence and increased opportunities to complete WPBAs.


This now allows consultants to focus on HSTs and summative assessments.

CBD clinics:

Dedicated CBD clinics are run off the shop floor to facilitate in-depth discussion between practitioners.

Education Fellows have been integrated to provide a tiered system; with consultants predominately focussing on HSTs and fellows assisting with more junior practitioners.





Conclusions:

There has been good uptake of the bookable sessions. Departmental education is becoming more accessible through the online booking system, and is improving access for WPBAs.

Feedback from simulations are positive. Staff find them to be a good educational opportunity, and regular exposure is reducing anxiety about participating in simulation.

#EM3 is growing in followers on social media and in traffic through the website, demonstrating that we are providing education both internally and external to the department.
